

## PURPOSE

### General

- Improve cocoa farmers income.

### More specifically, the project will

- Improve cocoa quality through technical training, stock management, fertilization methods, post-harvest investment, and training on infrastructure.

- Raise awareness and support creation and integration of cocoa co-op activities starting with local (existing) producer organizations. This cooperative buys and sells the wet cocoa beans from producers, carries out the wet bean process, and markets to economic operators (domestic or foreign).

## TARGET GROUP

- 630 cocoa producer families (ages 25 - 60)

## EXPECTED RESULTS

- 1) Appropriate structure and management of Cocoa Mayumbe Cooperative (target marketing goal: minimum 250 cocoa tons in that period);
  - 2) Infrastructure and materials for cocoa processing and storage (drying, transportation, packaging, storage etc.)
  - 3) Increased income for producer families, resulting in improved living conditions and development.
- Cocoa bean quality improvement resulted in a 50% increase in selling price in 2008.
