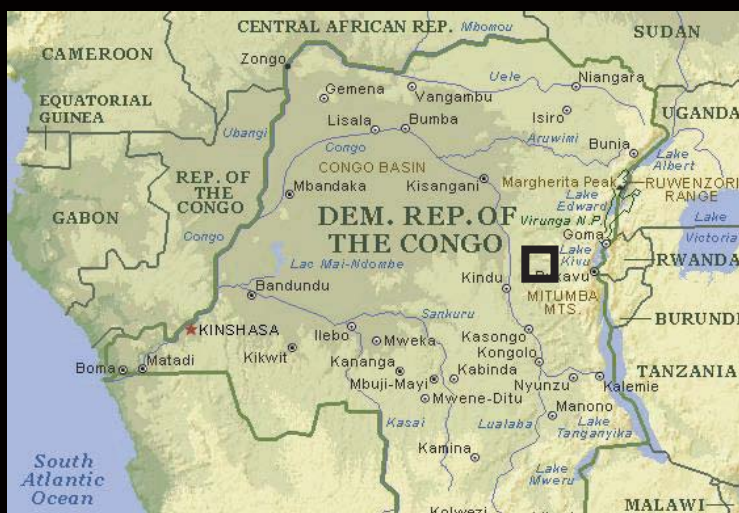

EXPECTED RESULTS

- 1) Sufficient equipment to grow coffee (hoes, machetes, etc.).
- 2) 36 tons of improved seed, quality improved plantations and higher coffee quality.
- 3) Find a place to hold cooperative activities.
- 4) Create a 20-member committee for the autonomous management of the cooperative.
- 5) Hire two agronomists and 5 assistants; paid by AFPDE.
- 6) Purchase one motorcycle to be used as means of transportation.
- 7) Coffee growers (1,889) trained on new coffee-growing techniques.
- 8) More than 100 hectares planted with coffee.
- 9) 4,500 coffee farmer children will receive appropriate education.
