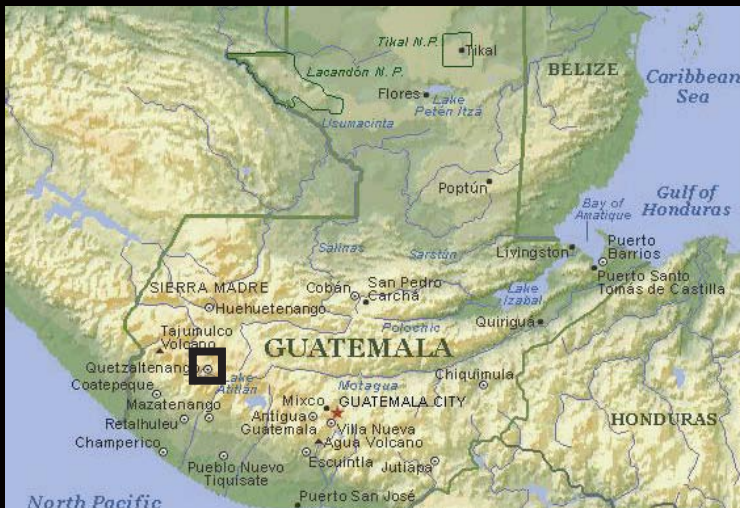

## EXPECTED RESULTS

- 1) Certification is based on the combined efforts of all plantation employees and the support of Renaud Cuchet, EFICO's representative in Central America. Plantation managers coached by Renaud on site on the entire process to becoming certified. Sustainability certificate enables real structural development and contributes to development.
- 2) Rainforest Alliance certified El Platanillo coffee was served in, among other places, the Federal Parliament of Belgium and was supplied there by Succes Koffie company of Niel. Certification ensures El Platanillo higher prices than those in the coffee market and ensures new market buyers demands can be met.
- 3) To address the conclusion calling for social investment, an elementary school was built in 2004 for 150 students in the plantation. It has brought unity to plantation residents and to those living in the region. The school has become the meeting place for the entire local community.
