

PURPOSE

Coffee harvesting is a challenging job in Guatemala, requiring long hours and insufficient resources to be able to take care of the needs of a family at home.

By introducing *Healthy Home Kits*, Habitat for Humanity Guatemala believes that the health of a family can make a life-transforming difference, improving the well-being and overall environment of each of these coffee growers.

The long-term goal is to see each and every family in Guatemala with a safe and decent home to call their own.

Specific Objectives:

- Distribution of Stoves, Waterfilters and Latrines:

Stoves: reduction firewood usage/indoor air pollution, decrease burn accidents, less deforestation, more efficiency

Water filters & Latrines: improvement of health, less diseases

- Community Involvement
- Improved habits in health, financial responsibility, general wellbeing

TARGET GROUP

47 families in total: families located in the heart of the coffee producing area of Huehuetenango; these families work at the neighboring coffee farms (Finca Palmeiras, Villatoro and Las Palmas).

All families are segmented well underneath the poverty line.



EXPECTED IMPACT

The long-term financial success and well-being of any family begins with a decent home, health and wellbeing for the entire family. By providing Healthy Home Kits, a chance for success for each of the partner family is offered in the long-term. It is very easy to see the strong correlation between a healthy famer and their ability to sustain themselves a living. With these vital home improvements that mean life-change to a community, these communities will have a much better chance at being able to support themselves and their families.

Description

- Habitat for Humanity Guatemala identified coffee families with a high need for housing solutions: the families all depend on the coffee activity.
- This project provides 47 partner families with Healthy Home Kits, containing smokeless stoves, improved latrines and/or water filters.
- Each family receives training in financial planning, disaster response, preventative health, nutritional cooking, project management, and stove/latrine/water filter construction. They are also responsible for contributing materials and labor in building these products under HFHG supervision.
